MIAMI'S BEST BITS

Ventanitas

We might be a driving city, but Miami's walk-up-window culture is holding strong with an array of beloved spots serving late-night bites, toothsome tacos and delish sandwiches.



1. Mary Coin Laundry & Deli

Fuel up after a night out with a scrumptious pan con bistec—tender steak, lettuce, tomato, onions, ketchup and crispy potato sticks—at this 24-hour walk-up window attached to a laundromat.

2. The Alley Ventanita

Hidden away below *The Betsy Poetry Rail*, a public artwork inscribed with the words of 12 local writers, this *ventanita* slings contemporary Cuban classics like a veggie medianoche and a chicken-croqueta Cubano. It's the perfect stopover if you're headed to the beach or exploring the Art Deco district.

3. Taquería Viva México

Find authentic Mexican corn-tortilla tacos in the heart of Little Havana at this quaint sidewalk window that's decorated with colorful *papel picado*. The carnitas are great, but don't sleep on the juicy pig ears or the beef tongue (trust us).

4. Papo Llega y Pon

Since the 1970s, this Allapattah staple has been popular for its pan con lechón, a Cuban roast-pork sandwich that's doused in a tangy mojo sauce. Regulars know to order it "con cebolla y picante" for all the necessary accoutrements.

5. Pizza Tropical

This tiny joint located in the back patio at Gramps makes one of the best New York-style pies in Miami. Try it topped with sliced mushrooms (don't worry, it doesn't do the canned kind) and fresh basil.
